Blists Hill Victorian Town

- Travel back more than 100 years to experience the sights, sounds, smells and tastes of a recreated Victorian Town;
- Shops, cottages and workplaces;
- Traditional Victorian Fair;
- Canal Street - lined on both sides with shops, including a Drapers and Outfitters, Post Office, Photographers, Sweetshop and Fried Fish Dealers while the artisans' corner includes plumbers, tinsmiths and decorative plasterers;
- Watch traditional skills in action in the plumbers, decorative plasters and tinsmiths.

Jackfield Tile Museum



- Galleries show examples of individual tiles and period room settings depict various locations that would have been decorated with tiles;
- Walk through an Edwardian Tube Station, the bar of an Hotel, a children's hospital ward and a 1930s 'front room'. Huge panels depicting mediaeval stories and nursery rhyme scenes have been rescued from buildings;
- Find out how the different varieties were made.
- Workshop - have a go at decorating your own tile using the tube-lining technique.

- Built by Abraham Darby III and now recognised as one of the great symbols of the Industrial Revolution, the remarkable structure still dominates the small town that bears its name.
